Our workshops are extensive experiences which run for 3 days and are suitable for Year 10 – 12 students.






Introducing Suzanne Brimley - a passionate actor and teacher, with an aptitude for dance, voice and design.

She has a Bachelor of Arts from La Trobe University and a Diploma of Education from Victoria University. She holds an active Working With Children's Check and is First Aid qualified.



Is there a minimum age requirement to participate in this workshop?

We require 16 – 18 years for this workshop. The content we cover requires a maturity and capability which this age group is generally able to grasp and formulate a performance around.
